


# Falanai Ala Guest Speaker and Mentoring Programs Continues

## **Public Health Encourages Measles Vaccine**

The LA County Department of Public Health is encouraging residents to get their measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine, if needed, due to the increase in measles cases from those who traveled. As summer rolls around, it's expected that more travel may arise; therefore it's important to be protected. As of May 6th, there have been 4 confirmed measle cases in LA County, so it is highly encouraged for residents to review their immunization records, stay up-to-date on their vaccinations, and contact their health care provider if they experience any symptoms. For those who are uninsured or underinsured, please call 2-1-1 or click here for a list of clinics offering free or low-cost immunizations.

### **Community Health Stations with Lifesaving Products**

The LA County Department of Public Health launched 51 community health stations across the county and will continue to deploy a total of 100 health stations in the next few months. These community health stations have free life saving products easily accessible to residents. The stations have COVID-19 test kits, naloxone, fentanyl test strip kits, and condoms. There is a short anonymous survey at these stations; however, that is completely voluntary and is not needed to get the products. They are merely to collect demographic information. Community health stations can be found in this map.

#### Salmonella Outbreak linked to a Local Restaurant

San Diego County public health officials are looking into a salmonella outbreak linked to Aladdin Mediterranean Café in Clairemont. Fourteen confirmed and probable cases have been identified linked to this outbreak, as the individuals reported getting sick from eating at that Café either April 25th or 26th. The Café voluntarily closed in support of allowing health officials to investigate the situation. If it is determined that there is no more risk, they will be allowed to re-open back up.
